Thingwall Primary School's September Return to School Plan:

This plan is practically the same as the plan that we circulated in our July newsletter. There have been a couple of minor changes, mainly to do with the lunchtime arrangements and assemblies. One of the key measures the Government have put into place is the continuation of our 'bubbles'. Children are to only mix with the other staff and children from their bubbles and movement around school is kept to an absolute minimum. This is to prevent cross infection and, in the event that someone contracts COVID-19, it would hopefully mean that we would only need to close one bubble rather than the whole school for the recommended time.

Return to School:

DO BRING -

Water Bottles – The water fountains will be switched off. Therefore your child will need to bring a fresh bottle of water in each day. Please make sure your child's water bottle is clearly named.

Packed Lunches – If your child is an infant they will be entitled to a free packed lunch or a hot meal deal each day. If you require this please log onto our on-line system and select your child's preference. If your child is a junior and he/she wants a packed lunch provided by school, please log on in the same way, pay the usual price and choose your child's filling option. As KS2 will be eating in their classrooms we are not offering the hot meal deal so please do not select this option. If you want to provide your child with their own packed lunch then that is fine.

Sunhat, sun cream, sun glasses – If the weather is sunny you will need these items for your child. If your child prefers, they may like to wear the summer uniform if the weather is warm.

First Aid - There will be a designated first aider within each bubble and staff have been provided with PPE for first aid situations.



DO NOT BRING -

Please do not bring in pencil cases or PE kits for the time being. Pumps or trainers can be kept in the classroom (please ensure they are fully named). We are not allowed to use the cloakrooms at present so we need to minimise items brought in to keep the classrooms as clutter free as we possibly can. We will not be changing for PE for the time being. If this changes we will of course text you to let you know with plenty of warning. Staff will provide your child with pencils etc.

11+ Update:

We have been informed that the dates for the 11+ examination have been changed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Parents of pupils who have opted to take the examinations will have been emailed directly with the changes so please make sure you check your inbox if you are not aware of the new dates.



Adults on Site:

Please try to keep to only one adult per family on school grounds if you can and practise social distancing. We would recommend that you do not congregate in groups and wear a mask if possible. The exception to this rule will be for our new starters in FS2 – we understand completely that more than one adult may want to wave their child off on their first day at school! Again, the Trim

Trails are out of bounds and we would be grateful if parents could keep children (including pre-schoolers) off the equipment as we cannot guarantee it will be completely virus free. Also please keep off the Viking boat (outside the Computer Suite) as this has sadly not been built to withstand children (or Vikings) climbing aboard. Adults will not be allowed access to the school building unless by prior arrangement in very rare circumstances. If you do need to have a word with the office staff please ensure that you wear a face mask whilst in the Entrance Hall and please do not enter the Entrance Hall if you can see another family inside already. If you need to have a word with your child's class teacher please let them know and they will endeavour to ring you back as soon as they are able to.



School Calendar:

We are sure that you will appreciate that this term will be very different than other Autumn Terms. We will circulate a school calendar over the next few weeks but we anticipate that Parent's Evenings will be by telephone appointments and that Harvest Festival/Christmas Services will be conducted within bubbles and without our usual audiences. Apologies in advance for these changes, we hope to get back to greater normality in the Spring Term.



Recovery Curriculum:

Our first half term back at school will focus largely on the emotional health and well-being of the children and the re-establishing of routines. We recognise that every family will have had a totally different experience of the lockdown and we want to help the children make sense of what they have been through and to support them back into school. We will be following the Ealing PSHE Recovery Curriculum alongside our usual National Curriculum and each week we will have a different focus to help the children feel safe and secure.
