RE Quality Mark Award:

Biodiversity and Bloom Bid - Liverpool City Region:

We had superb news last week that we have been awarded with a grant of almost £5000 from the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority's Community Environment Fund for our new 'Biodiversity and Bloom' project! Many thanks to Anna Barnish, Abi Holbrook and Miss Yardley for applying for this prestigious grant earlier on in the year, we are thrilled to have been chosen by Steve Rotheram.

The aim of the project is to create garden and habitat zones within the school grounds to increase biodiversity, improve health and wellbeing and facilitate education about sustainability, ecology and the environment. The ideas for the project were based on feedback from pupils across the

school and our eco-council reps about how to improve the school grounds, whilst also learning more about how to protect and improve our environment.

The project will create 3 garden zones within the school grounds:

- 1) A habitat zone for birds, amphibians, pollinators and other minibeasts.
- 2) A wild zone for wildflower planting, relaxation and sensory planting.
- 3) An allotment zone for growing fruit and vegetables.

Bringing this big project to life will be a whole Team Thingwall effort involving all pupils, plus volunteers from the wider school community to make it happen. Watch this space for more information and opportunities to get involved in the new year.
