We are delighted to share the wonderful news that Miss Kilikita and Mr Fletcher welcomed twin boys into their family on Wednesday, November 12th. Vincent (7lb) and Lennon (5.5lb) are now home and thriving. Their big sisters, Hazel and Delilah, are utterly smitten and Miss Kilikita is doing brilliantly. We can't wait to meet the newest members of the Kilikita/Fletcher family - it's sure to be a joyful (and very busy!) Christmas in their household.



Thank you POTs and Team Thingwall families:

We wanted to take the opportunity to thank POTs for all that they do for our school in this newsletter and to let parents know a little about how the much-valued funds that have been raised by various events have been spent.

So far this term, POTs have given school £3000 to spend on sensory hubs and sensory resources around school. The first wooden sensory teepee is situated on the infant corridor and we hope to take delivery of another teepee, which will be located in the junior library, very soon. Both teepees will contain sensory items and can be used if children are feeling at all overwhelmed at any point

during the school day. These sensory hubs and resources are a vital part of the successful work we do for inclusion and we would not have been able to afford these items without your generous fundraising support, thank you all.

POTs have given us a very generous amount of money (over £1000!) to enable us to purchase much needed PE resources, to enable us to continue to effectively deliver PE across the school. Miss Yardley and the PE team received hoops, balls for tennis and dodgeball, long jump mats, javelin sets, footballs, bibs, rounders bats and skipping ropes, which all classes have greatly benefitted from - thank you.

POTs have been able to fund prizes for our weekly Good Work/Good Citizen assemblies, which have proved to be very popular with the children (especially the beautiful hologram stickers!) and they have also agreed to donate a considerable sum of money towards the annual Year Six Min Y Don residential visit to try to keep the costs as low as we can for families.

As well as all of the above, POTs have (as always) been working very hard in the background to benefit all Thingwall pupils - 50/50 club, neon disco, Breakfast With Santa, teas and coffees for various performances to name just a few...Thank you all.

This year, POTs have offered to fund an exciting Christmas craft afternoon for each class, which will take place in the final week of term. We are thrilled and have excitedly taken delivery of baubles, stained glass Nativity lanterns, velvet wreaths to name just a few items. Please keep an eye out for our social media and December newsletter as we hope to share some wonderful craft items with you, every child has been given this opportunity thanks to all who voluntarily support our school - thank you so much.

Reception, Year One and Year Two Nativity photographs have been taken once again by Mrs Webster (Jack and Maisie's Mum) who is a professional photographer www.jackaroophotography.co.uk. These beautiful photographs will be available to purchase before/after the performances and we are very grateful for the time she has given voluntarily to benefit our school, thank you Mrs Webster.

We are also incredibly grateful to GRA Accountants who have agreed to fund our upcoming accreditations for the Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM) and the RE Quality Mark (REQM) - without this very generous cash donation, we would have lost both quality marks as school does not have the finances to renew at this time, thank you all at GRA Accounting.

Quite simply, we could not manage to make school so exciting and interesting without the support from POTs and our families. Thank you all.




Annual Parent Survey:



My child is happy at this school.


65 responses

My child feels safe at this school.


65 responses



This is a super response, with 65/65 of families who answered, agreeing their children are safe at Thingwall Primary.


The school makes sure its pupils are well-behaved.





Again, this is another super response, with 65/65 of families who answered, agreeing children are well-behaved at Thingwall Primary.

My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively 65 responses




This is a mixed response, with 56/65 of families who answered, stating their children have not been bullied at Thingwall Primary. Out of the remaining 9 families, we were pleased that 7 agreed the issue had been dealt with swiftly and effectively, meaning that 2 families felt the issue had not been resolved. If those 2 families could contact the class teacher, we can further support your child, ascertain why the issue has not been resolved and hopefully rectify the situation.






This is a good response, with 61/65 of families who answered, agreeing they are made aware of what their children are learning at Thingwall Primary. This is a question that we listened very carefully to last year and we have put a lot of additional measures in place to keep families fully updated. This year, we have sent welcome letters detailing what your child will learn during the year, held welcome meetings/workshops, used social media/communication (Facebook, Instagram, Arbor, X, Tapestry), held our Autumn Parents Evenings, FS2 Stay and Play, schools website – see School Information, Curriculum and Learning Zone tabs, introduced Friday Flyers and our usual newsletters, POTs communication, as well as ensuring we respond promptly to all emails, calls and face to face meetings. We are aware we needed to delay the FS2 parent workshop, so possibly these parents responded to the survey before that meeting. If anyone has any further ideas about how we can make you aware of your child's learning, please do not hesitate to let us know.

When I have raised concerns with the school, they have been dealt with properly. 65 responses




This was a pleasing response with 64/65 families who answered, feeling we respond to concerns. We *think* the 1 family who feel we have not responded appropriately may have made an accidental typo, as the rest of their survey was very good so we would urge them to contact school as soon as possible if they feel they have any outstanding concerns that we have not properly dealt with.

Does you child have special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)? 65 responses




If you answered yes to the above question, how strongly do you agree with this statement... My child has SEND, and the school gives them the support they need to succeed.

14 responses




This was a mixed response with 9 responses agreeing or strongly agreeing we have given their children the support they need to succeed and 5 responses stating they are unsure. If you require any further information about the way your child is supported with their SEND, please do not hesitate to ask the class teacher and/or approach the school office for an appointment. We are able to see that 3 of these responses could actually be typos as the children do NOT have SEND so this could have slightly skewed the data for this question.

The school has high expectations for my child. 65 responses




This was a good response, with 63/65 responses telling us we do have high expectations for their child.




This was another excellent response, with 65/65 families agreeing that their child does well at Thingwall Primary.

The school lets me know how my child is doing. 65 responses





There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school. 65 responses





This was a good response with 61/65 of the families who responded indicating that there is a good range of subjects available, with 4 indicating they are unsure. Please be assured we follow the National Curriculum and ensure that we also incorporate as many enrichment activities as we are able to.

My child can take part in clubs at this school (before/during/after school clubs) $_{\rm 65\,responses}$





3/65 of the responses indicate that their child does not have the opportunity to take part in clubs at Thingwall. On analysis of the data, we can see that there actually are fewer clubs offered to the younger pupils, specifically those in Year One and Reception. Therefore, we will try to organise some clubs for our younger pupils going forward from January onwards, watch this space...





This was a good response with 61/65 responses agreeing we do support children's wider personal development at Thingwall. Out of the remaining 4 responses, 3 parents did not know and we think this could possibly be that the Ofsted terminology of 'wider personal development' is not easy to understand. In a nutshell, 'wider personal development' means lessons and other wider school activities that help you grow into a confident, kind, and capable citizen both in and out of school. This could mean clubs, assemblies, values charter, school visits, residentials, community links, POTs, reward assemblies for example – not an exhaustive list.





This 65/65 response was lovely to read, thank you to all of you for your continued support and the time you have taken to respond.

All things considered, this was a really successful survey and gathering the views of the Thingwall parent body has, yet again, proved to be an extremely valuable school improvement tool. Thank you for all of your lovely responses. The next newsletter will go into the positives and ways forward identified at the end of the survey in more detail.
