Please find a message below from Mr Gordon Lester, our Chair of Governors.

It has been another challenging half term for Thingwall and as Chair of Governors I would like to thank you all for your support in making sure that the Thingwall community weathers the storm and continues to thrive. I would particularly like to recognise and thank POTS for the tremendous work that they do and the really fabulous way that their fund raising supports the school.

I would like to keep you updated about the work of your Governing Body and Mrs Evans' newsletter is the best way of achieving this. The Governors meet as a full Governing Body 4 times a year. There are Parent Governors, Co-opted Governors and Staff Governors, thus ensuring that there is a broad span of experience. These meetings are supported by three sub-committees, Staffing and Finance, Standards and Strategy and Health & Safety. They all have clear terms of reference and cover all aspects of school life. The Full Governing Body receives very comprehensive headteacher's reports at its meetings, these plus regular school visits (COVID permitting) ensure that the Governors kept informed.

The Staffing & Finance Committee monitors the budget and all expenditure that the school makes ensuring that value for money is achieved. It receives regular staffing updates and works closely with Mrs Evans to ensure that the school has the best staff available. Currently our priorities are ensuring that the finance is available to ensure that the post Ofsted plans can be achieved.

The Standards and Strategy Committee monitors the standards in the school through regular briefings from Mrs Evans, members of the Senior Leadership Team and curriculum leaders. The School Development Plan and all the associated plans are regularly reviewed. These reviews include behaviour and attitudes which is a focus for us all. We have been briefed on the exciting plans to boost reading and we all hope that your elves are being read to!

The Health & Safety Committee covers all aspects of the building and plans within the school ensuring that the staff and children can work in a safe and healthy environment. They are currently chasing up the company responsible for the gates and share your frustration at its frequent breakdowns. The Committee was heavily involved in the recent change of Preschool and After School care. There are regular monitoring tours of the building to ensure that it is safe.
