Staff and Parent Consultation:

As you will be aware, we are currently consulting staff and parents about joining the Oak Trees Multi Academy Trust on September 1st 2023. Thanks to all staff and parents who were able to attend last week's meetings. They were very informative and it was a good opportunity to meet with Mike Collins (Thingwall's Chair of Governors), Tony Lacey (CEO of the Oak Trees MAT) and also Hardip and Emily who are overseeing the consultation in their capacity as project managers. NSPCC Numbers Day:

This coming Friday, 3rd February, we celebrate the NSPCC's Number Day. We are inviting children to come into school wearing a Dress Up for Digits outfit (please don't panic, this can be as simple as wearing your own clothes/school uniform with your favourite number painted on your cheek!) and we will take part in a series of fun maths activities. The aim of the day is to bring about a positive, feel good, can-do attitude towards maths as well as raise awareness for the NSPCC charity. We understand that times are financially hard at the moment but if you would like to make a small donation of loose change towards the day, we will be happy to get our Year Six pupils to count it all up and send it off to the charity on your behalf. Many thanks to Miss Taylor, who has organised the day for us – we hope it will be a fun, maths related day for us all.



Ugandan Field of Cabbages Appeal:

We were able to send an impressive £100 to Dennis Agaba, our DRIP Uganda coordinator last week to help our twin school and their families purchase seeds and equipment needed to enable them to grow a field of cabbages. The families will use some of the crop to supplement their daily diet but they also plan to sell the cabbages on to others as food for other families and also for herds of animals. The funds made will then be ploughed back into the local economy and thus generate further profits. We would like to thank Nicky Bolton, Heswall Primary School's Deputy Head Teacher for organising this initiative with Dennis and we are excited to see the resulting crops as Dennis has promised to send us lots of photos! These funds were collected at the carol services at church last month, so please thank any of the congregation who generously donated. This appeal also fits beautifully with our school's community garden and Anna Barnish (POTS Chair) is also eager to grow some vegetables, including cabbages, as part of our Liverpool City Region grant.



POTS Update from Mrs Barnish:

As referred to in the paragraph above, in July 2022, POTS successfully secured funding from Liverpool City Region for a number of bio-diversity initiatives for our school grounds and for the school community to join in with.

So far, overgrown trees and shrubs from the vegetable patch have been removed and once the weather warms, raised beds will be installed and we hope to plant our own field of cabbages.

We hope that the children enjoyed decorating their bird box at the Christmas Fayre and that these are hanging in your garden ready for the birds for the spring. We'd love to see some pictures – please add to our Facebook page or send to us via email.

POTs now have 10 bug house kits to give away. The first **ten** families to email <u>Thingwallprimarypots@hotmail.com</u> with their child's name and year will receive a kit to build at home. All we ask is that you send in a photo of your finished house to our email address with a short sentence on why you have made a bug house and where you've positioned it.

Here is a simple way to make a bug hotel in your garden:

If you have some bricks, wooden boxes or pallets to hand, why not build a multi-storey minibeast mansion and treat your guests to some 5-star accommodation? Divide it into sections and stuff each part with different natural materials. Dry leaves, twigs, hollow stems, dead grass, pine cones and bits of bark are ideal. They'll help to create warm, dry spaces that will attract different creepy crawlies. **Good for:** lots of different types of minibeasts such as ladybirds, bees, woodlice and spiders. You might even get frogs or hedgehogs coming to stay.

Thank you to Ken and the Shed Heads:

At the very end last year, one of our past parents, Mark Johnson, offered to make us a selection of wooden items with his group 'Ken and the Shed Heads'. We have been delighted to take delivery of three miniature wooden sheds, made from reclaimed materials, and these are now sitting proudly around school, ready for use. Many thanks to Mark, Ken and the other shed head volunteers. The sheds are going to be very useful for us!



We have three sheds in total...

- Child Book Swap Shed This is situated in the school canteen and anyone at all can swap books. There are
 already quite a selection of books in there and Oliver and William (our Year Five reps) have added books for
 younger pupils to the top shelf and books for our older pupils to the lower shelf. Please feel free to come and
 browse after school with your child/children. At the moment we have a full set of Judy Moody books, many of
 the Horrible Histories non-fiction books, some Horrid Henry books and some lovely picture books which would
 be suitable for our FS2, Year One and Year Two pupils.
- 2. Food Bank Shed This is situated in the school entrance hall so please feel free to pop in and help yourself (just remember a plastic carrier bag!). At present, we have quite a few tins of soup, beans and spaghetti, several packs of pasta, lots of tea bags and some other non-perishable items. We are expecting a NEO delivery very soon, so there will be a greater choice in the near future. Again, Oliver and William (our Year Five reps) are in charge of keeping the shelves stacked and categorised to make it easier to find the products you are looking for. Thank you boys, it's lovely to see two of our older Thingwall pupils really get into the spirit of helping the Thingwall community.
- 3. Adult Book Swap Shed This is situated in the school entrance hall and, as with the children's shed, it is available for any of our parents, carers or grandparents to swap books. Miss Durn is looking after this shed for us so if you have any queries, please do not hesitate to ask her.



School Assurance Professional Visit:

Tuesday, 10th January, saw us receive a Local Authority School Assurance Professional visit from HMI, Simon Hunter. This visit was similar to an Ofsted visit (except Thingwall were able to determine the agenda for the day) and every Wirral school will be visited by one of these specially appointed consultants by the end of this academic year. We were thrilled that Simon recognised the many strengths that our school has and he agreed with our self evaluation judgements which is great news as it proves senior leaders are aware of the school's strengths and the ways forward needed to ensure continued growth. Simon looked in particular at Early Reading, Phonics, Maths, Geography, RE, general behaviour and attitudes around school and subject leadership.

Simon gave us good in every area, with particular strengths in Behaviour and Attitudes and Personal

Development, which is great news and testament to the hard work of all staff and all pupils. Simon spoke to approximately 20 of the pupils and they were able to tell him about school life very eloquently and positively. If your child spoke with Simon, they should be very proud of the mature and sensible way they behaved and answered questions. Well done everyone, we are meeting with Liz Davidson (our School Adviser) later this week to look at the report in more detail.


Family Toolbox:


