#### Subject Leader Updates:

We like to keep you as informed as we possibly can and thought that you may like to read updates from our subject leads, to help you understand how the curriculum is constantly evolving at Thingwall. Please find subject paragraphs below...



# English:

Our whole school focus for English this year is writing. We have been working closely with the other MAT schools to continue to improve teacher knowledge and understanding of the teaching of writing. Our year began with a focus on sentence structure using a programme called 'The Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar'. The skills learned are continually referred to by all teaching staff in order to ensure pupil's understanding of the basics of sentence writing are secured. We introduced a new handwriting scheme in September and pupils are working really hard to make sure that all of their writing is presented properly. Pupils continue to enjoy the rich texts that we use to teach writing and we have seen excellent improvements across the school.

Reading remains a priority at Thingwall and we urge all pupils to read regularly at home. We look forward to this year's World Book Day and celebrating books, authors, characters and our shared love of reading. Uptake on the 'Reading With My Elf' twitter competition was lower this year but we were proud to present Evelyn from Year Five with her prize for taking part. We have also been excited to establish links with West Kirby Book Shop, taking two Year Five pupils recently to help us replenish our upper KS2 libraries. **R Arden** 



#### Maths:

EYFS maths curriculum is taught through the Mastering Number programme which aims to secure firm foundations in the development of good number sense. Children in Years 1 and 2 continue to engage with the programme with the aim to achieve fluency in calculation and a confidence and flexibility with number by the end of KS1.

Times tables knowledge is vital in Years 3 and 4 and we are looking to add to our range of exciting resources to help your child achieve automaticity with these, enabling them to apply their knowledge to their maths learning.

Years 5 and 6 continue their focus on arithmetic skills to strengthen their conceptual understanding. Our maths progress and attainment is strong and has been recognised by the MAT as a strength of our school's teaching and learning.

# **Computing:**

We continue to use Purple Mash as our scheme for teaching computing. Pupils enjoy the range of lessons and activities available. Pupils across the school are benefiting from our excellent computing resources. We now have two class sets of iPads and a class set of Chromebooks which we use across the curriculum. We have been working closely with other MAT schools to continue to improve our curriculum and earlier this year, year 6 were lucky to be taught coding by a computing specialist from Hilbre High School. Online safety remains a high priority at Thingwall and we urge parents to use the resources linked on our website to help support staying safe while online at home.

#### Science:

This year, all year groups are finding exciting ways to enhance their science curricula as we work towards renewing our Primary Science Quality Mark next year. The children have been taking part in focused scientific investigations to put their conceptual knowledge into practice, examples of which have been showcased on the school's X account.

Our science and Eco teams are working closely to find ways to improve outdoor learning opportunities within our school grounds.

#### Early Reading and Phonics:

We have continued to see positive results across KS1 and Reception in reading and are really proud of how hard the children are working in their phonics and guided reading sessions. We feel that in continuing to build children's confidence in reading, it will really help to nurture a lifelong love of reading. #### Early Years:

We are continuing to develop our outdoor spaces and children have been enjoying the mud kitchen and climbing equipment which were new for this year. Our curriculum follows the interests of the children and as

requested we will have an Aldi shop in our indoor role-play area very soon! Following from an Ofsted report, called 'Stronger Foundations', we are looking closely at the ways we can further develop some of the suggestions into our day-to-day classroom life, including making more time for key skills, such as correct pencil grip, letter formation and early maths skills, such as subitising (recognising an amount from sight to 10) and providing greater opportunities for communication and language skills. We feel all of these currently sit within our provision and are looking at ways to enhance them further.

# DT

We have worked with Kapow and have shared feedback on how the scheme has been implemented successfully from September 2024 to date. We have also made the MAT decision to come away from whole class floor books in favour of using personal DT portfolio books to enable us to better show individual progression over the years.

# History:

The subject lead has attended an Oak Tree MAT meeting to meet with other History subject leads in the Autumn Term to use the Education Endowment Foundation Five Day Report document to outline ways to adapt teaching and learning, making the subject accessible for all. Information was collated by the Oak Tree MAT leaders to compile an Oak Trees bespoke document. A school staff meeting took place to outline expectations in all History books across the school. All year groups must use a time line to refer to when periods of time are studied- this is used as a reference point to make links with other periods of time covered to help understand chronology. A sample of History books were moderated across the school by Mrs Evans and Claire Arnold in November to ensure coverage, progression and fidelity to our scheme. The Year Two History visit took part in November, linked to Victorians and later in the month, a Victorian School role play day was enjoyed by Year Two in school. Finally, Year Six interviewed residents of Trepassey on their visit to school to hear first-hand memories of the past, linking to World War 2.



# Geography

The subject lead has attended an Oak Tree MAT meeting to meet with other Geography subject leads in the Autumn Term to use the Education Endowment Foundation Five Day Report document to outline ways to adapt teaching and learning, making the subject accessible for all. Miss Kilikita attended also, in order to shadow the role as subject lead as part of her professional development. A staff meeting slot discussed expectations in all Geography books - using world maps as a reference point inside Geography books when parts of the world have been a focal point and see where these places are in relation to UK. A sample of Geography books were moderated across the school by Mrs Evans and Claire Arnold in November to ensure coverage, progression and fidelity to our scheme.

#### Modern Foreign Languages:


