Edsential School Meals:

Please be aware that the cost of an Edsential school meal is increasing on June 1st to £2.68 (currently £2.41). We are aware that this is quite an increase in costs but we are pleased to confirm that the school dinners for children in FS2, Year 1 and Year 2 will remain free as part of the UK Universal Free School Meal entitlement. However, If you think you might be eligible for the Free School Meal entitlement, please apply ASAP - even if your child is still in FS2, Year 1 or Year 2. This is because school receives substantial extra funding for each child registered for Free School Meals.
