Road Safety Competition:

This week the children have been finding out how to cross the road safely as part of Road Safety Week. Pensby Road is an extremely busy main road and we have recently asked Wirral Council if we could install further metal safety fencing on the grass verges to encourage our pupils to cross at the safe points and discourage people from parking illegally on the pavements. We are also hoping to get some warning signs to promote speed awareness. We will be launching a road safety art competition over the next few weeks to encourage adults to park safely. All councillors agreed to raise these matters with their respective classes and to report back to the next council meeting.

As you can read, the ideas were very sensible and the children took their role very seriously indeed. Thank you Miss Hine for organising everything so well. The next time the School Council meet it will be to interview a local MP. We will report back with the minutes of this meeting once Parliament is started up once again after the December 12th elections.
